Renovation of a house or an apartment in Belgium

- Different steps
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1.Define Your Budget & Financing for the renovation



It is very important to establish from the outset (ex-ante) the budget that you can dedicate to the renovation.



A preliminary contact with a builder is useful, but it is then necessary to consult an architect. An architect can indeed help you in understanding which kind of investment is the most appropriate for your life in the new property.



An architect can concretely help you to define the priorities. This can facilitate the request of a loan to the bank.



2. Your Renovation Scope: elements to consider

Do you need **structural work** (roof, walls,
foundations) or **cosmetic improvements** (painting,
flooring, kitchen
upgrades)?

Consider energy efficiency upgrades (insulation, heating systems) to qualify for subsidies.



3. Find Contractors & Compare Quotes

- You can contact builders via references (friends, social relationships, reputation, etc.) to receive an estimation of the budget needed.
- It is then important to compare the different offers.
 This is a complex exercise to carry out without the intervention of an architect.

4. The Architect's missions

- The architect must fulfill a mandatory legal mission that falls under the monopoly of the profession. This includes two phases:
- DESIGN
- SUPERVISION OF WORK EXECUTION:

Ensure the works meet safety & energy regulations to obtain an **EPB (Energy Performance Certificate)** after renovations.

Only a professional person can assist you in finding the good solution. The consultation of a builder is not enough!

5. CONTRACT WITH AN ARCHITECT



After a first meeting, if you have agreed the fees and have therefore decided to work with the architect, it is important to sign a **contract**.



It is essential that the signed contract is the result of a negotiation conducted with full knowledge of the facts. The text needs to have been fully acknowledged and understood by the parties.



There are several methods for calculating fees: a percentage based on the value of the works, an amount based on the surface area of the building, a flat rate, an hourly rate, etc.



Be aware that the rates, which are usually offered, are higher for renovations than for new constructions, due to the nature and number of difficulties to adapt the project to the existing situation.



To help the client to understand the fees of the architect, the Order of Architects has developed a tool that gives you an estimate of the number of hours of service required for your project. One can consult the service calculation on the website.

6. Get Permits & Permissions



In Belgium minor renovations (painting, flooring, kitchen updates) usually do not need a permit.




Major renovations (roof changes, extensions, structural modifications) require a building permit (permis d'urbanisme / omgevingsvergunning).

7. WORKS



An architect can help you in finding a good and competent builder, with whom you can sign a contract.

The architect monitors the execution and ensures that the planning is respected.

During works, it is essential that the architect monitors the works and drafts regular reports on their progress.

The architect can also assist you in making the choices of the best material to use.
